English


The 7 and 8 English Curriculum requires students to develop critical literacy skills. This term our students across every classroom are learning how to identify in any text what the author's intended purpose is for the text they have written or read.

Identifying the writer's purpose and point of view.

It is important for readers to identify that behind every text is a writer with a purpose and a point of view. When reading a rich text teachers this term will be focussed on getting students to:

- Identify what they think the writer's purpose was.
- Discuss who they think the intended audience is?
- Search for specific evidence of the writer's personal thinking and point of view.
- Consider what has been included and what has been excluded?
- Does this text have any possible impact on individuals or groups of people?

This week I spoke with two Y8 students from Room 28 Amber and Janet who clearly had been learning about an author's purpose and it was fabulous to discuss with these students how every text has a purpose.



Student Led Conferences

On Monday this week we had approximately 500 families visit our kura to listen to their child discuss their learning.

Parents were able to hear about what their child has been learning in reading, writing and maths along with te reo, inquiry learning and additionally visit the specialist subjects.

Sharing learning with whanau is an integral part of maturing as an adolescent learner. We value this event on our school calendar.
