Term 3 Inquiry - Speak Up, Speak Out!

This term across our school we have an inquiry centred around learning from "The Arts" curriculum.

Bianca explained to me that this new learning introduced her to a very amazing wahine that had a very powerful message. Bianca was grateful for connecting this famous photograph to a true story and a huge part of Aoatearoa NZ's history.
