ANZAC Day Commemoration

On Friday, 25 April, Pukekohe Intermediate School had the honour of hosting the local ANZAC Day commemorations for our community.

This significant occasion was well-attended by members of the local community, RSA representatives, and our dedicated staff, reflecting the strong connection between our kura and the wider Pukekohe whaanau.

A special highlight was Year 8 student Shelby Howard-Matene who delivered The Ode in te reo Maaori with confidence and pride, standing alongside Doug McNally, President of the RSA, who shared The Ode in English. Their contribution beautifully symbolised the unity of tradition and cultural identity in Aotearoa.

The memorial stones at the front of the school were adorned with red ANZAC poppies, creating a respectful and striking tribute to those who served.

We are proud to play a part in remembering the sacrifices made for our country and to provide our students with opportunities to engage meaningfully with our nation's history. Lest we forget.

Te Taamataanga o Pukekohekohe – Opening Ceremony

On Monday morning, a group of students from our Maaori bilingual classes had the privilege of attending the Te Taamataanga o Pukekohekohe Opening Ceremony, accompanied by their kaiako Matua Antonio, Whaea Iwa, and myself.

Te Taamataanga o Pukekohekohe is a newly opened full immersion wharekura that stands as a testament to 18 years of vision, planning, and unwavering community collaboration.

This was a special cultural occasion that gave our ākonga the chance to see tikanga Maaori in action, experience mana motuhake in education, and connect with taura from a local kura—strengthening ties through whakapapa, community, and whanaungatanga.

We extend our heartfelt thanks to the kaiako and taura of Te Taamataanga o Pukekohekohe for their warm manakitanga and for allowing us to be part of such a momentous occasion. He taonga te ako – Learning is a treasure.

Teaching and Learning

Science is alive during the first week of term 2!

This term our school programme of inquiry is all about Science with a particular focus on the Physical World.

All of our classrooms this week have been visited by the Auckland Watercare education facilitators to learn about where our water comes from in Auckland when we turn on the tap!

Y7 students are investigating drinking water by putting several filtration products to the test.

Year 8 students are involved with an in depth presentation on wastewater treatment. They are now very aware what happens to everything in the toilet when it is flushed away!

Students then participated in a liquid density experiment in which they can change the density of different coloured water to make a rainbow.

Such a positive hands on experience for our students to engage is the Science curriculum and connect with Auckland Watercare.


Well done to the following students who won the poster competition for High School Musical.
