Healthy Active Learning - Voice of Tamariki Survey

Our school has been invited to be part of the 'Voice of Tamariki' (VoT) Survey run by CLM Community Sport. The survey is jointly run by Sport NZ and CLM Community Sport and seeks to understand the sport and physical activity experiences of tamariki (children) at school.

About the survey
