Teaching and Learning

The NEW - New Zealand Curriculum - Te Mātaiaho

As parents and carers, you want the best for your children. And the New Zealand Curriculum is designed to ensure just that. The strengthened national curriculum is organised into five phases of learning and includes year-by-year teaching and learning sequences.

This means your child will build on their last year's learning.

It sets out what your child is expected to learn over their time at school including the intended levels of knowledge, understanding and skill to be achieved.

The new curriculum is clear, sequenced and evidence-based.

It means teachers will use explicit teaching which involves connecting current learning to what your child already knows, providing concise step-by-step explanations with your child's input, and discussion, explaining, modelling and demonstrating new learning, regularly checking for understanding and providing feedback and providing opportunities for your child to practice both in groups and independently.

The New Zealand Curriculum is the building blocks that support your child's growth. At Pukekohe Intermediate School we have;

- 1. Implemented the new maths curriculum across the school this year with all teachers being provided a new yearly overview with exactly what to teach, when to teach it and in what sequence. In October the maths curriculum was further updated. These changes will be introduced in 2026.
- 2. Been learning as a staff from new research about the "Science of Learning' and how students learn best through specific teaching approaches. Students have told us they like it when their teacher is clear with exactly what the task is, when the teacher allows them to have a go but with support and how important it is to have time to practice, not just once but, many times.

In 2026 as a school we will begin to unpack the new English curriculum introducing the new content in our classrooms, deepen application of the new maths curriculum and include more opportunities for students to re-practice, be re-taught and revise new content. Lots of "new" for our staff who are doing an incredible job!

Accelerated Learning in Writing

This week it was my honour to celebrate with students from Room 14, 48, 40 and 43 along with their teacher, the progress and success in writing. Every student shared with me what made a difference in their writing progress this year and what their classroom teacher did that supported them. Congratulations to these students for really working hard, taking risks, persevering when writing was hard and most importantly gaining confidence in their ability as authors.

Our staff Erin Warne, Sharon Boon, Amy Ash and Paul Grant committed to developing their practice with an outside facilitator and committed to providing their students with explicit teaching approaches. Incredible staff, striving to be the best teacher for their students.

Celebration of writing this week did include Mrs Fryer's shout for icecreams.... at 10 am!









Waste Audit 2025

On Wednesday, our Kaitiaki leaders rolled up their sleeves and completed our annual waste audit, guided by our incredible Sustainable Schools Advisor, Kylee.
