Attendance

Thank you to everyone who has worked so hard to improve, strengthen, and maintain attendance this year.

Your collective mahi — from our tamariki, whaanau, and kaiako — has made a real difference.

As you know, the expectation for 2026 remains at 85% attendance or above, and the Government's target increases to 90% by 2030.

The Ministry of Education has asked us to lift our school attendance rate to 90% from 2026 onwards. This is a lofty challenge, but one I know we can achieve!

What our attendance data shows
The graph highlights how well our students
have done this year:

- 72% of our students (467 tamariki) had less than 5 days' absence in a term placing them in the Good category with a strong chance of success.
- 17% (110 students) had up to 10 days' absence, placing them in the Worrying range where progress becomes harder.
- 8% (51 students) had up to 15 days' absence, which is considered Concerning.
- 4% (24 students) had 15 or more days' absence, the Serious Concern category where learning progress is very hard to maintain.

These results show that the majority of our students and whaanau are doing an outstanding job. With continued support, we know we can shift even more learners into the Good attendance range next year.

Weekly Attendance Updates for Whaanau


To help everyone stay informed, weekly attendance updates will be sent home for each child. This ensures whaanau have a clear picture of how their child is tracking and helps avoid any unnecessary concerns when students who have not been attending regularly are unable to participate in certain school events.

achievements of our tamariki. Many of
our students have managed to maintain
100% attendance this year, and they are
very much looking forward to being
recognised for this exceptional
milestone.

Responding to all absences

The Government's target is for 80% of students to attend regularly, that is to attend school more than 90% of the time.


